## **WELCOME TO SAA!**





We celebrate and honor your decision to reach out for assistance from Sex Addicts Anonymous®. We wish to extend to you a genuine welcome to the fellowship! SAA has helped many people stop addictive sexual behavior. We are a volunteer 12-step recovery program. There are no dues or fees. Membership is open to all who have a desire to stop addictive sexual behavior. There is no other requirement.

To help you get started, we recommend you follow these steps:

- Attend SAA meetings: Meetings are the heart of the SAA program and the principal way
  to learn about recovery. (See meeting info section below) We recommend that you
  attend at least six meetings before you decide if the program is right for you.
- Read Our Literature: Review the literature enclosed in this packet. Also, review the first 100 pages of SAA's primary text, "Sex Addicts Anonymous." (aka the "Green Book") (See "How to Buy or Obtain SAA Literature" below.) Literature can be read for free at https://saa-recovery.org/literature/
- 3. <u>Find a sponsor</u>: A sponsor acts as a guide or mentor and will help you get started in the program and work the Twelve Steps. (See "Getting a Sponsor" pamphlet)

#### **About Meetings**

- · All meetings are free of charge
- Meetings are either 60 or 90 minutes in duration
- . There is no obligation to speak until you're ready to do so
- Anyone who thinks they may have a problem with sex addiction can attend
- A member of SAA will lead the meeting and give clear directions
- The meetings will start with some readings or a short talk on some aspect of recovery followed by individual sharing
- During the sharing period, you may speak if you wish to do so
- There is no registration and no records are kept
- We only use first names
- We practice strict anonymity and confidentiality; what is seen or heard in the meeting stays in the meeting
- In-person, telephone, and web-based meetings are available


